## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Nine

An Act to certify community health workers in Massachusetts..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	Pursuant to Section 110 of Chapter 58 of the Acts of 2006, which mandated
2	recommendations for a community health worker certification program, Chapter 13 of the
3	Massachusetts General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after Section 97 the following:
4	Section 98: There shall be a board of certification of community health workers
5	hereinafter called the board. The board shall be included in the Division of Health Professions
6	Licensure at the Department of Public Health. The board shall regulate the training and
7	certification of community health workers and shall have the following duties:
8	develop and administer a certification program for community health workers, including
9	training and continuing education requirements, adopting a system to document and recognize
10	prior learning, mastery of core competencies, and including grandfathering guidelines for
11	certification of community health workers practicing in Massachusetts at the time of passage of
12	this section;

13	develop and administer certification programs for individuals, community health worker
14	trainers and organizations that train community health workers, including guidelines defining
15	training curricula based on core competencies and guidelines for additional training in
16	specialized areas of practice;
17	develop, administer, and enforce provisions for granting and revoking certification for the
18	practice of community health work and the training of community health workers;
19	conduct public hearings and keep records and minutes as are necessary to carry out its
20	duties. The board shall provide a 30 day public notice of the times and places of all hearings
21	authorized under this section, in a manner it may determine.
22	The board shall consist of 11 members to be appointed by the governor. One member
23	shall be the commissioner of the department of public health, or his/her designee, who shall chair
24	the board. Additional members shall be appointed to ensure representation of all six geographic
25	regions of the executive office of health and human services and shall include no fewer than four
26	community health workers selected from recommendations offered by the Massachusetts
27	Association of Community Health Workers; one representative of a community health worker
28	training organization; one representative of the Massachusetts Public Health Association; one
29	representative of the Massachusetts Association of Health Plans; one representative of the
30	Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers; one community-based CHW employer
31	representative and one consumer representative familiar with community health worker services.
32	Of the first appointments three shall serve one year, three shall serve two years and four
33	shall three years. Each appointed member of the board thereafter shall serve terms of 3 years. No

34	member shall be appointed to more than 2 consecutive full terms. A former member shall again
35	be eligible for appointment after a lapse of one or more years.
36	The board shall, at its first meeting, and annually thereafter, elect from among its
37	members a vice-chairperson, and a secretary. Such officers shall serve until their successors are
38	elected. The board shall meet at least quarterly or more often upon the call of the chairman at
39	such times and places as the chairperson shall designate.
40	Board members shall serve without compensation but be reimbursed for necessary
41	expenses incurred in the discharge of their official duties.
42	The board shall be supported, subject to appropriation, with a director, administrative
43	assistant, and such other professional staff and operating expenses as are required to discharge its
44	responsibilities under this section.
