## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

An Act relative to the speed limit in cities and towns..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. Section 17 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004
2	official edition, is hereby amended by deleting the word "thirty" in the second sentence and
3	inserting in place
4	thereof the following words:— "twenty five".
5	SECTION 2. Section 18 of said Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
6	hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph the following new paragraph:
7	"Notwithstanding the foregoing, upon a vote by the city council, the transportation
8	commission of the City of Boston, the board of selectmen or town council as the case may be, a
9	city or town may make special regulations as to the speed of motor vehicles on functionally
10	classified local ways; provided however, that the way in question is wholly contained in the
11	municipality; provided, further, that a professional engineer in civil or traffic engineering
12	registered within the Commonwealth and the chief of police or the board or officer having
13	control of the police in a city or town first certify in writing that such regulation is consistent

- 14 with the public interest and public safety; provided further, that such regulations shall not be
- 15 subject to the approval of the department of the registrar. For the purpose of this paragraph, a
- 16 functionally classified local way shall be a public way in a residential area and a public way
- 17 between a residential area and a minor commercial area."
