An Act to create a Vietnam Veteran license plate..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2004 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting at the end of section 2 the following paragraph:
- The registrar shall furnish, upon application, to owners of private motor vehicles and
- 4 motorcycles who are Vietnam Veterans as defined by the United States Veterans Administration,
- 5 and upon evidence deemed satisfactory by the registrar, distinctive registration plates bearing the
- 6 words "VIET-NAM-VETERAN" and accompanied by a distinctive logo as created by Michael
- 7 McNulty of Danvers.
- 8 There shall be a seventy-six dollar fee for said plates in addition to the established
- 9 registration fee for private passenger motor vehicles and motorcycles. Upon the issuance of
- motor vehicle registration plates bearing the words "VIET-NAM-VETERAN", the registrar shall
- deduct the costs directly attributable to the issuance of such plates and the balance remaining to
- the Soldiers' Homes in Chelsea and Holyoke, Massachusetts. Sixty per cent of the total revenues
- shall be deposited into a retained revenue account at the Soldiers' Home in Chelsea, and forty
- per cent of the total revenues shall be deposited into a retained revenue account at the Soldiers'

- Home in Holyoke. The funds generated by the sale of such plates shall be used at the soldiers'
- homes for facility maintenance and patient care, including personnel costs. At no time shall any
- portion of the revenues be paid into the general fund.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or specific law to the contrary, the first
- 19 "VIET-NAM-VETERAN" plate shall be created for Michael McNulty of Danvers.
