An Act relative to veterans' benefits equity..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

3 Whereas, veterans receive specific state-funded benefits and protections under

4 Massachusetts General Laws, and;

5 Whereas, Massachusetts prohibits discrimination based upon a person's sexual

6 orientation, and;

7 Whereas, the Constitution of the Commonwealth recognizes the right of same-sex

8 couples to marry, and;

9 Whereas, the Federal government has prohibitions for those serving in the armed forces

10 against homosexual conduct and considers the marriage of persons of the same sex grounds

11 sufficient for discharge, and;

Whereas, all veterans in the Commonwealth deserve the same rights and benefitsregardless of sexual orientation or marriage status,

15 SECTION 2. Section 7 of Chapter 4 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing in 16 the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end of Clause 43 the following-17 "(4) Nothing in this clause shall be construed to deny benefits to anyone discharged 18 solely under Article 125 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice when such discharge was the 19 result of consensual behavior between legal adult persons; or anyone discharged solely under 20 Chapter 37 of Title 10 of the US Code, Section 654. Nor shall anything in this clause be 21 construed to deny benefits to a same-sex spouse of a veteran. 22 The Department of Veterans' Services shall promulgate regulations as necessary to 23 ensure veterans discharged under the above mentioned codes, and/or same-sex spouses of 24 veterans, may appeal their eligibility status for Chapter 115 benefits that they would otherwise be 25 entitled to under Massachusetts General Laws and regulations. 26 Any veteran and/or same-sex spouse of a veteran, whose discharge is determined to be 27 the result of consensual behavior between legal adult persons, or anyone discharged solely under 28 Chapter 37 of Title 10 of the US Code, Section 654, shall be eligible for and receive benefits 29 under this section."
