An Act relative to protect orders..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 34E of chapter 208 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- Any judge faced with a person seeking a protective order shall ask such person whether
- 4 he is involved in any current litigation including any other protective order, divorce, divorce
- 5 modification, child support issues, assault, assault and battery or any other court action in any
- 6 probate court of the commonwealth and, if the response is yes, said judge shall take whatever
- 7 action he deems appropriate to address the immediate issue and shall then postpone any further
- 8 action on the issue for no more than 10 days during which time the court where said judge is
- 9 sitting shall forward or otherwise transfer the case to said probate court.
