## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

An Act relative to mobile student populations..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. Section 11 of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding after the word "district", in line 163, the following
3	clause:-

4 (j) the number of mobile students, defined as any student who enrolled in the district for 5 less than one academic year, and also, when attainable, the reason for student transfer in to the 6 district.

7 SECTION 2. Subject to appropriation, the department of elementary and secondary 8 education shall develop a pilot grant program for school districts with schools with high mobile 9 student enrollment for the purpose of developing and implementing programs to ensure the 10 successful transition and academic success of mobile students. For the purpose of this section, 11 mobile student shall be defined as any student who has been enrolled in a public school district 12 for less than one academic year and mobile student enrollment shall be the average of the 3 13 previous fiscal years of the number of mobile students enrolled. Grants shall be awarded to 14 school districts for programs designed to (a) provide welcome and transition assistance programs 15 for mobile students; (b) provide tutoring in core content and, as needed, English for Speakers of 16 Other Languages; (c) assess the impact of mobile students on non-mobile student academic 17 success; (d) provide guidance and support services targeted to mobile students; or (e) other 18 programs determined by the department of elementary and secondary education to meet the 19 needs of mobile students and school districts with high mobility populations. The department of 20 elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the 21 provisions of this section.

22 SECTION 3. The department of elementary and secondary education shall issue a report 23 on the impact of the rate of student mobility on growth in student academic achievement for all 24 underperforming schools and chronically underperforming school districts, if any; provided, that 25 student mobility rate shall refer to the percentage of students enrolled in a public school district 26 for less than one academic year; and provided, further, that said report shall be provided to the 27 clerks of the senate and house of representatives who shall forward the same to the chair of the 28 senate ways and means committee, the chair of the house ways and means committee, and the 29 house and senate chairs of the joint committee on education on or before December 1, 2011.
