## An Act RELATIVE TO THE REDUCTION OF PARTICULATE EMISSIONS FROM DIESEL ENGINES..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	Section 1. Chapter 30 of General Laws is hereby amended by adding, after Section 39S
2	the following new section:

3 Section 39T. A commission be and the same is hereby created consisting of eleven (11) 4 members appointed as follows: two (2) of whom shall be members of the senate appointed by the 5 senate president; two (2) of whom shall be members of the house appointed by the speaker of the 6 house; one of whom shall be the secretary of transportation or his/her designee; one of whom 7 shall be the commissioner of the department of environmental protection or his/her designee; one 8 of whom shall be the commissioner of the department of public health or his/her designee; and 9 four (4) of whom shall be appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be a representative from 10 an environmental advocacy organization, one of whom shall be a representative from a health 11 advocacy organization, one of whom shall be a representative from the transportation industry, 12 and one of whom shall be a representative of the construction industry.

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14	The commission shall study the impact of and solutions for addressing diesel emission
15	pollution from heavy duty diesel vehicles. The commission shall produce a report identifying
16	programs the Commonwealth can implement to further reduce diesel pollution levels from the
17	heavy duty vehicles used to perform state contracted work. Said report shall be submitted to the
18	governor, the senate committee on ways and means, the house committee on ways and means,
19	the joint committee on environment, natural resources, and agriculture, and the joint committee
20	on public health no later than one (1) year from enactment. The report shall include, but not be
21	limited to, findings and recommendations that include the following:

24	and social service publications that have documented studies to support the findings;

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levels of technology currently available for retrofitting vehicles, and the estimated amount of
time required to retrofit a vehicle;

37 (5) The types of projects that shall require the use of heavy duty diesel vehicles that
38 meet the U.S. EPA 2007 on-road emission standards or have been retrofitted with the appropriate
39 emissions control technology. This review shall also consider any bidding and purchasing rules
40 that would need to be amended in order to properly award contracts for the specified projects;

41 (6) The cost and administration of a heavy duty diesel vehicle retrofit program including
42 the source of funds, the administration of such funds, and how priorities for retrofitting will be
43 established;

44 (7) An analysis of any competitive advantages that may or may not be created for
45 contractors that successfully participate in a retrofit program; and

46 (8) The reporting requirements necessary to track the number of heavy duty diesel
47 vehicles in use, the number of retrofits that are achieved under the program, and which state
48 entity is responsible for reviewing and analyzing such reports.

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50 Appointments to the advisory commission shall be made not later than thirty days after 51 the effective date of this statute. If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the vacancy shall be 52 filled within thirty days. The commission shall expire upon reporting its findings and 53 recommendations.

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55	The secretary of transportation or his/her designee shall serve as chairperson of the
56	commission. The members of the commission shall meet at the call of the commission
57	chairperson. The meetings of the commission are subject to Chapter 39 of the General Laws.
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59	Members of the commission shall serve without compensation. The members of the
60	commission representing the department or the general court shall serve without additional
61	compensation.
