An Act relative to teacher retirement..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law, rule or
2	regulation to the contrary, a teacher, as defined in Chapter 32, who has been laid off because of
3	budget cuts and has been recalled to active service may have such layoff time credited as
4	creditable service. The State Teachers Retirement Board and State-Boston Retirement Board
5	shall promulgate rules and regulations concerning buyback payments with regular interest. Such
6	layoff time shall be considered as a leave of absence without any break in service. This bill
7	would allow teachers who were laid off through no fault of their own but because of budget cuts
8	to purchase up to four years of creditable service in the retirement system.
