## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Nine

An Act relative to identification cards..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. Section 8E of Chapter 90, of the Massachusetts General Laws, as so
2	appearing, is hereby amended by inserting after the last sentence the following new paragraph:-
3	An identification card or any renewal thereof issued to an applicant shall expire on an
4	anniversary of the operator's date of birth occurring more than twelve months but not more than
5	sixty months after the effective date of such identification card. An identification card for any
6	applicant under twenty one shall expire on the twenty first birthday of such an applicant. An
7	identification card issued to an applicant born on February twenty-ninth shall, for the purpose of
8	this section, expire on March first.
9	SECTION 2. Section 34B of Chapter 138, of the Massachusetts General Laws, as so
10	appearing, is hereby amended by striking paragraph one and paragraph two and inserting in place
11	thereof the following paragraph:-
12	Any licensee, or agent or employee thereof, under Chapter 138 of the Massachusetts
13	General Laws, who reasonably relies on such an identification issued pursuant to section eight of

14 chapter ninety, or on a valid passport issued by the United States government, or by the 15 government, recognized by the United States government, of a foreign country, or a valid United 16 States issued military identification card, for proof of a person's identity and age shall not suffer 17 any modification, suspension, revocation or cancellation of such license, nor shall he suffer any 18 criminal liability, for delivering or selling alcohol or alcoholic beverages to a person under 19 twenty-one years of age. Any licensee, or agent or employee thereof, under Chapter 138, who 20 reasonably relies on such an identification card or motor vehicle license issued pursuant to said 21 section eight, for proof of a person's identity and age shall be presumed to have exercised due 22 care in making such delivery or sale of alcohol or alcoholic beverages to a person under twenty-23 one years of age. Such presumption shall be rebuttable; provided, however, that nothing 24 contained herein shall affect the applicability of section sixty-nine.
