An Act establishing a healthy child scholarship..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Whereas, Governor Deval Patrick and the Executive Office of Health and Human
2	Services have announced a comprehensive plan called Mass in Motion to promote healthier
3	lifestyles and combat overweight and obesity in the Commonwealth; and
4	Whereas, one of the programs established through Mass in Motion will mandate Body
5	Mass Index (BMI) testing of students attending public schools in the Commonwealth; and
6	Whereas, one-third of middle and high school students in the Commonwealth are
7	reportedly overweight or obese; and
8	Whereas, being overweight or obesity increases the risk of developing serious medical
9	conditions such as diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, certain forms of cancer, and stroke; and
10	Whereas, those with serious medical conditions place greater demands on the health care
11	system and increase costs; and
12	Whereas, healthy lifestyles can begin during adolescence; and

13	Whereas, it is in the interest of the Commonwealth to contain rising health care costs and
14	encourage our students to exercise and eat healthy;
15	Therefore, be it enacted, as follows:
16	SECTION 1.
17	Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby
18	amended by inserting after section 16 the following section:-
19	Section 16A. Healthy Child Scholarship
20	The board of higher education, in consultation with the department of public health, shall
21	establish a "Healthy Child Scholarship." The board shall adopt guidelines governing the
22	implementation of the scholarship, which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
23	(1) the scholarship shall be awarded to tenth grade students attending public schools in
24	the Commonwealth who are within an acceptable BMI range or who have improved their BMI
25	since the test was last administered in middle school, provided in both instances that BMI testing
26	is administered at the school;
27	(2) the amount of the scholarship shall not be less than \$100 and shall not be presented
28	publicly by any state or local authority or official;
29	(3) the scholarship shall be presented by the board on behalf of the governor and the
30	legislature, but under no circumstances shall the scholarship funds shall be distributed until the
31	student verifies enrollment in an undergraduate or associate degree program at a state institution
32	of higher learning. The board shall make each recipient aware of the guidelines of the
33	scholarship program.

34 (4) the board shall document the name and contact information of each scholarship
35 recipient and shall make reasonable efforts to notify recipients during their senior year of high
36 school of the scholarship funds they have been awarded and the eligibility for receiving such
37 funds.

38 The board and the department of public health shall promulgate such regulations and39 other written guidance as needed to implement and administer the scholarship.
