An Act to promote self-sufficiency.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 110 (d) of Chapter 5 of the Acts of 1995 is hereby amended by
2	inserting after the end of the first paragraph the following paragraph: -
3	"Notwithstanding any law or provision to the contrary, families ineligible for cash
4	assistance may be considered recipients for purposes of eligibility for employment support
5	program funded services, including child care, provided that such services are made available for
6	the purpose of enabling recipients to begin and/or maintain employment, and that a sliding scale
7	is used to administer those benefits in a manner consistent with facilitating economic
8	independence."
