The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act concerning genocide education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
- 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 67. Genocide, shall be included in the Massachusetts history and social science
- 4 curriculum frameworks for United States and world history. Case studies of at least 2 such
- 5 genocides may be used to demonstrate the concept of genocide. Such case studies may include,
- 6 but are not limited to, the genocide of Armenian Christians, the Holocaust and Nazi
- 7 concentration camps, the genocide of Cambodians by the Khmer Rouge, the genocide of Bosnian
- 8 Muslims, the genocide of Rwandan Tutsis and the genocide of Darfurians by the Sudanese
- 9 government.

- The department shall recommend curricular materials detailing the underlying causes, international reaction, progression and aftermath of the aforementioned genocides, including those recommendations established by chapter 276 of the acts of 1998.
- The department may provide trainings, seminars, conferences and materials for educators to use in the teaching of genocide.
