The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act requiring mental health parity for disability policies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 108 of chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
 adding the following:-
- 3 "13. No individual policy of short-term or long-term disability insurance providing
 4 income replacement benefits that is issued or renewed in the Commonwealth shall impose
 5 benefit limitations or exclusions upon claimants affected by behavioral health disorders, where
 6 such limitations or exclusions are not imposed equally upon claimants affected by physical
 7 disorders."
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 110 of chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
 9 adding the following subsection:-
- "(Q) No certificate of coverage under a group policy of short-term or long-term disability
 insurance providing income replacement benefits that is issued or renewed in the Commonwealth
 shall impose benefit limitations or exclusions upon claimants affected by behavioral health

- 13 disorders, where such limitations or exclusions are not imposed equally upon claimants affected
- 14 by physical disorders."
