In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act increasing the experience and background necessary to operate low pressure processed steam boilers..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 146, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is
2 hereby amended by inserting, in line 17, after the words “a district engineer inspector” the
3 words: - “who shall be a licensed Massachusetts First Class Engineer”.

4 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any General or special law or any rule or regulation to the
5 contrary Section 13 of chapter 146, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended
6 by inserting, after line 7, the following new section:- “All facilities with low pressure processed
7 steam boilers below fifteen (15) pounds involved in the process, production and manufacturing
8 of a product or commodity, or chemicals, shall require periodic attendance as defined in Section
9 46 of Chapter 146 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition. Said boilers
10 shall be operated and maintained by a dually licensed second class fireman. This license must be

- 11 renewed every five (5) years and shall require thirty (30) hours of training from an approved
- 12 school by the department of public safety”.
