In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to the coordination of children's mental health care and clinicians.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 22 of chapter 32A of the General Laws, as appearing in the
2 2008 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “setting”, in line 85, the
3 following words: -

4 and, for persons under the age of 19, shall include collateral services

5 SECTION 2. Subsection (i) of said section 22 of said chapter 32A, as so appearing, is
6 hereby amended by striking out the last paragraph.

7 SECTION 3. Said section 22 of said chapter 32A, as so appearing, is hereby amended
8 by adding the following subsection:—

9 Under this section, the following words shall have the following meanings unless the
10 context requires otherwise:-

11 “Collateral services”, face-to-face or telephonic consultation, of at least 15 minutes in
12 duration, by a licensed mental health professional with parties determined by the licensed mental
13 health professional to be necessary to make a diagnosis, and develop and implement a treatment
14 plan.

15 “Licensed mental health professional”, a licensed physician who specializes in the
16 practice of psychiatry, a licensed psychologist, a licensed independent clinical social worker, a
17 licensed mental health counselor, a licensed nurse mental health clinical specialist or a licensed
18 marriage and family therapist.

19 SECTION 4. Chapter 118E of the General Laws, as so appearing, is amended by
20 inserting after section 10F the following section:—

21 Section 10G. (a) The division shall provide coverage for collateral services performed by
22 a licensed mental health professional for persons under 19 years of age. Nothing contained in this
23 section shall be construed to abrogate any obligation to provide coverage for mental health
24 services pursuant to any law or regulation of the commonwealth or the United States or under the
25 terms or provisions of any policy, contract, or certificate.

26 (b) Under this section, the following words shall have the following
