By Mr. Sánchez of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1525) of Jeffrey Sánchez, William N. Brownsberger and Jonathan Hecht relative to nutrition in government buildings. Public Health.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to nutrition in government buildings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting, after
2 section 224, the following section:-

3 Section 225. (a) As used in this section, the following words shall, unless the context
4 clearly indicates otherwise, have the following meanings:-

5 “Competitive foods or beverages”, all foods or beverages sold or provided in vending
6 machines; provided that competitive foods or beverages shall not include non-sweetened
7 carbonated water.

8 “Government buildings”, all executive offices, boards, commissions, agencies,
9 departments, divisions, councils, bureaus, and offices, now existing and hereafter established.

10 "Nutritional standards”, the standards promulgated by the department of public health.

11 (b) All foods or beverages sold or provided in government buildings shall meet
12 nutritional standards as promulgated by the department; provided, that the department shall
13 consider nutritional and dietary recommendations as developed by state, federal and independent
14 departments and health advisory associations.

15 (c) All competitive beverages sold in vending machines in government buildings shall be
16 limited to beverages that comply with the nutritional standards.

17 (d) All competitive foods sold in vending machines in government buildings shall be
18 limited to competitive foods that comply with the nutritional standards.

19 (e) All government buildings shall report all foods and beverages that comply with the
20 nutritional standards to the operational services division, including but not limited to vendor and
21 products.

22 (f) The operational services division of the executive office for administration and
23 finance shall procure a state-wide contract for vending machines that provide or sell competitive
24 foods or beverages that shall meet nutritional standards, provided that the division shall negotiate
25 lower prices.

26 (g) Every 2 years, the department shall conduct a review of the nutritional standards and
27 update the nutritional standards as needed.

28 SECTION 2. The department of public health shall promulgate standards required by
29 this act on or before July 1, 2011.

30 SECTION 3. Subsection (d) of section 225 of chapter 111 of the general laws shall take
31 effect on July 1, 2014.

32 SECTION 4. Subsection (f) of said section 225 of said chapter 111 shall take effect on
33 July 1, 2016.
