An Act relative to retired capitol police officers disabled in the performance of duty.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 32 of the General Laws or any other general or  
2 special law to the contrary, Albert Delorey of Hernando, Florida, Kenneth Dorrance of Pelham,  
3 New Hampshire, Francis W. Holland of the town of Stoneham and Thomas H. Keough of  
4 Englewood, Florida, formerly Capitol Police officers, each of whom has been retired under the  
5 provisions of this chapter or similar provisions of earlier law on account of injuries sustained or  
6 of hazard undergone in the performance of his duty shall have his retirement allowance increased  
7 to an amount not exceeding one-half the rate of regular compensation payable to state police  
8 officers holding similar positions, at the time of increasing such allowance, in the comparable  
9 grade or classification, as determined by the personnel administrator, occupied by such former  
10 officer at the time of his retirement.
