3	Section 54C All elementary and secondary schoolteachers in the Commonwealth of
4	Massachusetts shall be required to be certified in the administration of cardiopulmonary
5	resuscitation, as evidenced by the successful completion of a training course in cardiopulmonary
6	resuscitation from the American Red Cross, American Heart Association or other agency

7 approved by the Department of Public Health.
