An Act relative to real estate tax payments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The definition of “ Real estate tax payment” in paragraph (1) of subsection
2 (k) of section 6 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is
3 hereby amended by adding the following sentence: - Notwithstanding the foregoing, any person
4 who has deferred all or part of his property taxes by signing a tax deferral and recovery
5 agreement, shall be considered to have paid the amount deferred on the date of signing such
6 deferral and recovery agreement during the taxable year for the purpose of qualifying for any
7 exemption hereunder.
