An Act Designating a Certain State Owned Bridge in the town of Randolph as the Charles L. Bowley Memorial Bridge.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           The department of conservation and recreation horse bridge No. R-01-012(597) spanning  
2 state highway route 24 in the town of Randolph, located between exit 20B and the route 93 north  
3 and south interchange, shall be designated and known as the Charles L. Bowley Memorial  
4 Bridge, in memory of Charles L. Bowley, a civic leader in the town of Randolph and founder of  
5 Harmony Hill Farm. The department of conservation and recreation shall erect and maintain  
6 suitable markers bearing the designation in compliance with the standards of the department.
