By Mr. Chan of Quincy, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1867) of Tackey Chan for legislation to allow certain store and shops to open on holidays. Community Development and Small Businesses.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act to allow certain store and shops to open on holidays.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Clause (50) of Section 6 of Chapter 136 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the last sentence in the first paragraph the following: -

3 “Notwithstanding the provisions of the previous two sentences, this exemption shall
4 apply to any store or shop that receives the approval of the municipal licensing board where said
5 store or shop is located; provided that, the municipal licensing board has determined that the
6 shop or store opening on any said legal holiday is not discriminatory to its employees, the store
7 or shop primarily services ethnic foods and goods, does it not violate any collective bargaining
8 agreement and it is able to comply with all other laws and regulations.”

9 SECTION 2. Section 15 of Chapter 136 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
10 inserting at the end of the sentence in the third paragraph the following:-

11 “;provided however, notwithstanding the provisions of this clause, the board shall
12 approve an exemption for any store or shop that receives the approval of the municipal licensing

13 board where said store or shop is located; provided that, the municipal licensing board has
14 determined that the shop or store opening on any said legal holiday is not discriminatory to its
15 employees, the store or shop primarily services ethnic foods and goods, does it not violate any
16 collective bargaining agreement and the it is able to comply with all other laws and regulations.”

17 SECTION 3. Section 16 of Chapter 136 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
18 inserting at the end of the last sentence of the first paragraph the following:-

19 “;provided however, notwithstanding the provisions of this clause, any store or shop that
20 receives the approval of the municipal licensing board where said store or shop is located;
21 provided that, the municipal licensing board has determined that the shop or store opening on
22 any said legal holiday is not discriminatory to its employees, the store or shop primarily services
23 ethnic foods and goods, does it not violate any collective bargaining agreement and it is able to
24 comply with all other laws and regulations.”
