By Mr. Pedone of Worcester, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1896) of Pedone relative to establishing a special commission to study the education, regulation, licensure, supervision or oversight of veterinary technicians and veterinary assistants Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 An Act to provide for the safe care and treatment of animals.

2 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled,
3 and by the authority of the same, as follows:

4 Section 1: There shall be a special commission to consider the regulation and licensure of
5 veterinary technicians and veterinary assistants in the Commonwealth. The commission shall
6 consist of the following members: The Chairman of the Commonwealth’s Board of
7 Registration in Veterinary Medicine or his designee, who shall serve as chair of the commission;
8 the Commissioner of the Department of Agricultural Resources or his designee; the
9 Undersecretary of the Office of Consumer Affairs and Business Regulation or his designee; two
10 representatives of the Massachusetts Veterinary Technical Association; and two representatives
11 of the Massachusetts Veterinary Medical Association.

12 Section 2: The Commission shall broadly consider whether changes should be
13 recommended, either through statute or regulation, in the education, regulation, licensure,
14 supervision or oversight of veterinary technicians and veterinary assistants. Specifically, the
15 commission shall:

16 a) consider whether the current regulation of Assistants and Veterinary Technicians
17 under 256 CMR 8.00: M.G.L. c.112 Sections 54 and 58 is adequate to protect the health and
18 safety of animals under veterinary care;

19 b) consider whether and how to encourage greater professional knowledge and skill
20 levels for veterinary assistants and/or technicians;

21 c) address the impact of recent changes in the Veterinary Technician Technical
22 Examination requirements

23 d) consider issues relative to supervision, experience, education, and training of
24 veterinary assistants and technicians

25 3) take into account the special requirements of veterinary technical assistants and
26 technicians working for the Department of Agriculture

27 Section 3: The commission shall make a report, including recommendations for changes
28 to statute or regulation, to the Joint Committee on Municipalities and Regional Government and
29 the Joint Committee on Licensure and Consumer Protection by May 1, 2011.
