By Mr. Jones of North Reading, a petition (accompanied by resolve, House, No. 1932) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr. and others providing for the establishment of a special commission (including members of the General Court) to make an investigation and study relative to eliminating the tenure system and replacing it with a student performance system in the public schools. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

Resolve relative to teacher additional compensation.

1	Resolved, Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, there shall be a	
2	special commission to study and report on ways to improve current methods of teacher	
3	compensation and the the tenure system, including a function to measure and reward teachers for	
4	student performance. The commission shall consist of the commissioner of education; 3	
5	members of the house of representatives, 2 of whom shall to be appointed by the speaker of the	
6	house, and 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house; 3 members of the	
7	senate, 2 of whom shall be appointed by the senate president, and 1 of whom shall be appointed	
8	by the senate minority leader; the Commissioner of Elementary and Secondary Education; a	
9	representative of the Massachusetts Teachers Association; and a member appointed by the	
10	Governor. The scope of the commission shall include, but shall not be limited to: researching the	
11	possibility of replacing the teacher tenure system with a system of annual bonus compensation	
12	tied to student performance; analyzing the financial impact to cities and towns of altering the	
13	compensation and the possibility of eliminating the tenure system and replacing it with a student	

- 14 performance system and investigating possible definitions for student performance including the
- 15 annual yearly performance index. The commission shall submit its report to the board of
- 16 education, the joint committee on education, and the senate and house clerks no later than six
- 17 months after the passage of this act.
