Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1D of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 28 and 29, the words "as well as" and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the following words:- ", and shall provide for instruction in".
