The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act to establish safe staffing levels at skilled nursing facilities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Department of Public Health shall establish minimum staffing 2 requirements at Skilled Nursing Care Facilities and for all level I, II and III long-term care 3 facilities (as defined at 105 CMR 150.001). Working with 1199SEIU and other appropriate 4 stakeholders, the Department shall develop amendments to the existing Nursing Services 5 regulations (105 CMR 150.007) that ensure these facilities employ an adequate number of 6 nurses, certified nurse assistants, and other staff to both meet all patient needs and ensure that 7 sufficient staff is working at any given time to safely meet those needs. Said amended 8 regulations shall include specific standards and direct-care staff-to-patient ratios to ensure 9 consistent delivery of quality care in a safe and sanitary facility. The Department shall issue 10 public recommendations on these issues no later than six months following final passage of this 11 Act.
