An Act relative to the cancellation of certain health insurance policies.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 100H of Chapter 175 is hereby amended by inserting after the  
2 section, the following sentence: An insured individual age sixty-five or older can designate  
3 someone else to be notified sixty days prior to the date of intended cancellation. If the company  
4 fails to notify the individual designated by the insured, such policy shall remain in effect until  
5 such notification or until ninety days after the insured reaches age sixty-five, whichever shall  
6 first occur.
