**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

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**In the Year Two Thousand Eleven**  
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An Act to ensure transparency in executive compensation at private sector human service agencies.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 29: Section 29B shall be amended by adding the following sentences:--
- 2 Organizations providing social, rehabilitative, health, or special education services yearly shall
- 3 report to the commissioner the following information regarding the five highest paid employees
- 4 of the organization:-- yearly salary, payments to retirement and/or pension plans, travel and or
- 5 car allowance, housing allowance, and all other compensation for said employees; such reports
- 6 shall also include the percentage of said employee's compensation package that is derived from:
- 7 state contract dollars, municipal contract dollars, federal contract dollars, investments income
- 8 and charitable donations to the organization.
