Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 26 of chapter 121B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
- 2 official edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (o), the following subsection:—
- 3 (p) Shall deny access to public housing facilities that are subsidized by the commonwealth for all
- 4 persons who have been convicted of Level 2 or Level 3 sex offenses in the commonwealth.
