An Act relative to mooring fee requirements.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 33 of chapter 291 of the acts of 2004 is hereby repealed.

2 SECTION 2. Section 10A of chapter 91 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2006  
3 official edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 10 -12 the words “, provided,  
4 however, that no such mooring fees may discriminate on the basis of residence;”.
