An Act relative to pensions for felons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by
2	chapters 21 and 25 of the Acts of 2009, is hereby further amended by inserting at the end thereof
3	the following subdivision:
4	(5) Payments to a member retired under the provisions of this section who is incarcerated
5	for having been convicted of a felony committed on or after the effective date of this paragraph
6	shall cease for the period of such member's incarceration. Under no circumstances shall such
7	payments be recoverable by such member after such period of incarceration.
8	SECTION 2. Section 10 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by
9	chapters 21 and 25 of the Acts of 2009, is hereby further amended by inserting at the end thereof
10	the following subdivision:
11	(5) Payments to a member retired under the provisions of this section who is incarcerated

12 for having been convicted of a felony committed on or after the effective date of this paragraph

13	shall cease for the period of such member's incarceration. Under no circumstances shall such
14	payments be recoverable by such member after such period of incarceration.
15	SECTION 3. Section 26 of chapter 32 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2008
16	Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following subdivision:
17	(6) Payments to a member retired under the provisions of this section who is incarcerated
18	for having been convicted of a felony committed on or after the effective date of this paragraph
19	shall cease for the period of such member's incarceration. Under no circumstances shall such
20	payments be recoverable by such member after such period of incarceration.
21	SECTION 4. Section 28M of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
22	amended by inserting at the end thereof the following paragraph:
23	Payments to a member retired under the provisions of this section who is incarcerated for
24	having been convicted of a felony committed on or after the effective date of this paragraph shall
25	cease for the period of such member's incarceration. Under no circumstances shall such
26	payments be recoverable by such member after such period of incarceration.
27	SECTION 5. Section 28N of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
28	amended by inserting at the end thereof the following paragraph:
29	Payments to a member retired under the provisions of this section who is incarcerated for
30	having been convicted of a felony committed on or after the effective date of this paragraph shall
31	cease for the period of such member's incarceration. Under no circumstances shall such
32	payments be recoverable by such member after such period of incarceration.

33 SECTION 6. Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
34 inserting after section 65J the following section:

35 Section 65K. Payments to a member retired under the provisions of sections 65A to 65J, 36 inclusive, who is incarcerated for having been convicted of a felony committed on or after the 37 effective date of this paragraph shall cease for the period of such member's incarceration. Under 38 no circumstances shall such payments be recoverable by such member after such period of 39 incarceration.".
