Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 31A of chapter 7 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking in line 14 the words "officers and employees"
- and inserting in place thereof the following: "residents of the Commonwealth".
- 4 Section 2. Section 31A of chapter 7 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
- 5 amended by inserting, in line 21, after the word "section" the following: "; provided, the
- 6 amount of the award given to a contestant shall be equal to one percent of the expected reduction
- 7 in cost to state government, but in no instance shall the award exceed ten thousand dollars".
