## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act promoting home energy efficiency audits as a benefit of employment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 63 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 Section 38BB the following new section:-
- 3 Section 38CC. Home Energy Efficiency Audit Employee Benefit; deduction

4 In determining the net income subject to tax under this chapter a domestic or foreign

5 business corporation, at its election, may deduct one-half of the expenditures paid or incurred

- 6 during the taxable year with respect to providing employees as a benefit of employment the
- 7 combined services of an energy auditor conducting an analytically rigorous home audit to
- 8 identify areas of energy loss with a home contractor providing on-site implementation of
- 9 efficiency measures defined as "Level 1" home energy rating systems work by the Residential

10 Energy Services Network (RESNET) of the National Association of State Energy Officials;

- 11 provided one-half the expenditures incurred with respect to providing the combined energy
- 12 auditor/home contractor services be made pursuant to an energy efficiency plan approved by the
- 13 Department of Public Utilities pursuant to chapter twenty five, section 19 and chapter twenty
- 14 five A, section 11G.
