An Act to promote commercial ports in Massachusetts' gateway cities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 1. Chapter 63 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after Section 38BB the following new section:-
- 3 SECTION 38CC. Commercial Shipping Port Incentive Program in Gateway Cities
- 4 (a) As used in this section, the following terms shall, unless the context clearly requires 5 otherwise, have the following meanings:-
- 6 "Gateway Municipalities", as defined in section 3A of chapter 23A of the General Laws.
- 7 "Secretary", the secretary of housing and economic development.

(b) There shall be a credit against tax due pursuant to chapter 63 of the general laws equal to 5 percent of allowable costs, as determined by the secretary, for corporations operating within gateway municipalities containing a port facility capable of handling ocean going vessels that

- 11 utilize said port facility for the transport of components used by the corporation or finished
- 12 goods produced by the corporation.
