An Act relative to protecting police officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 13D of chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 4 to 7, inclusive, the words “for not
3 less than ninety days nor more than two and one half years in a house of correction or by a fine
4 of not less than five hundred nor more than five thousand dollars” and inserting in place thereof
5 the following words:- in a jail or house of correction for not less than 1 year nor more than 2 and
6 one-half years or by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 10 years, and by a fine of
7 not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000.
