

**HOUSE . . . . . No. 3571**

By Mr. Walsh of Framingham, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) (accompanied by bill, House, No. [BILL NUMBER]) of Chris Walsh for legislation to establish the position of architect of the State House. State Administration and Regulatory Oversight.

**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the Year Two Thousand Eleven**

**AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF ARCHITECT OF THE STATE HOUSE.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section  
2 6A the following section:

3 Section 6B. (A) The governor may select an architect of the state house from the list of  
4 nominees submitted to the governor by the commonwealth architect of the statehouse nominating  
5 committee pursuant to this section. The nominating committee shall submit a list of three  
6 nominees to the governor by February 1st. The governor shall appoint the architect within 30  
7 days after receiving the list of nominees. The architect shall be appointed to serve for a term of 4  
8 years or until a successor is appointed and qualified as provided in this section.

9 (B) (1) There shall be an architect of the state house nominating committee. The  
10 nominating committee shall consist of 2 members of the senate, 1 of whom shall be the senate  
11 president or the president’s designee; and 1 of whom shall be the senate minority leader or the  
12 minority leader’s designee; 2 members of the house of representatives 1 of whom shall be the

13 speaker of the house or the speaker's designee; and 1 of whom shall be the minority leader of the  
14 house of representatives or the minority leader's designee; and the governor or the governor's  
15 designee. The nominating committee shall serve without compensation.

16 (2) The nominating committee shall request and receive 5 nominations for the selection  
17 of the architect from the Massachusetts chapter of the American Institute of Architects. The  
18 nominating committee shall review all nominations and select a list of 3 nominees who are  
19 residents of the commonwealth and have achieved fellow status within the American Institute of  
20 Architects. Along with the names of the 3 nominees, the nominating committee will submit to  
21 the governor the nominee's biographical and professional information along with supporting  
22 representative material which will show, based on the nominee's professional accomplishments  
23 as a licensed architect and why the nominee is deserving of the recognition as the architect of the  
24 statehouse. The governor will select the architect from the list of nominees for a 4 year term.

27 (3) In addition to the powers and duties applicable to the nominating committee, the  
28 committee shall appoint a separate committee whose charge is to establish, maintain and operate  
29 a nonprofit corporation to be called the State House Trust, Inc. under chapter 180 for charitable  
30 and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.  
31 This committee shall consist of the architect of the statehouse or the architect's designee; the  
32 Massachusetts art commission curator or the curator's designee; the superintendent of the bureau  
33 of state office buildings or the superintendent's designee; the state auditor or the auditor's  
34 designee; and a person shall be a designee from the state historical commission. The purpose of

35 the State House Trust, Inc. will be to raise money for construction, reconstruction, installation,  
36 demolition, maintenance or repair projects at, on or within the state house which is deemed to be  
37 of architectural, cultural, aesthetic or historic merit. The State House Trust, Inc. will work in  
38 conjunction with the bureau of state office buildings to coordinate all efforts related to projects  
39 at, on or within the state house and grounds.

40 (c) In the event of a vacancy in the office of architect of the state house, the vacancy shall  
41 be filled in the same manner as the original appointment, and the person so appointed shall serve  
42 until a successor is appointed and qualified as provided in this section.

43 (d) The architect of the state house during his or her term shall seek to raise the  
44 consciousness of all people to a greater appreciation of the architecture and architectural history  
45 of the state house, and

46 (e) The architect of the state house shall be an honorary position and the person appointed  
47 shall receive no remuneration. The person appointed to the position of architect of the statehouse  
48 shall not be considered a state official or a state employee for such person's service in the  
49 position of architect of the state house.
