## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to specific curriculum for continuing education in schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 71of chapter 38G of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following 3 paragraphs:-
- The board shall require all public schools to develop a continuing education course. The
- 4 department of elementary and secondary education shall be responsible for establishing the
- 5 specific curriculum of the course. The course material should be covered in 4 to 6 hours during
- 6 professional development training.
- All educators are required to take the course within 3 years of hire or show that the
- 8 course material has been covered by their educational program within the last 10 years. All
- 9 teachers are required to take the continuing education course at least every 10 years.
