An Act to include substituted cathinones, also known as "bath salts," in class C substances.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 31 of chapter 94C, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is
