By Representative Linsky of Natick and Senator Spilka, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3869) of David Paul Linsky, Karen E. Spilka and others (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Natick to increase the membership of the town forest committee from three to five members. Municipalities and Regional Government. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act Expanding the Town Forest Committee of the Town of Natick from Three (3) to Five (5) Members.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 21 of Chapter 45 of the General
2 Laws, or any other general law or special law to the contrary, the Conservation Commission of
3 the Town of Natick may appoint a Town Forest Committee of up to five members to serve
4 without compensation for terms of no more than three years.

5 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
