**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the Year Two Thousand Eleven**

An Act relative to the installation of nontransparent window materials.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 9D of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing the 2010 Official Edition, is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after the third paragraph the following paragraph:-

3 Any person equipping a motor vehicle with nontransparent windshield and window  
4 materials shall be licensed as an installer with the registrar. In order to effect this licensing of  
5 installers, the registrar shall promulgate rules and regulations establishing: (1) the application by  
6 and examination of installers, (2) the application and examination fees to be paid annually by  
7 said installers and (3) the suspension and revocation of said licenses. In addition, licensed  
8 installers shall register with the chief of police in each municipality where installation occurs  
9 prior to any installation of nontransparent window materials.
