# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act supporting individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 10 of chapter 13 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
3	The board shall require that physicians complete training to address the needs of
4	individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
5	SECTION 2. Section 11C of said chapter 13 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
6	hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
7	The board shall require that physician assistants complete training to address the needs of
8	individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
9	SECTION 3. Section 11D of said chapter 13 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
10	hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

11	The board shall require that dieticians and nutritionists complete training to address the
12	needs of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
13	SECTION 4. Section 14 of said chapter 13 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
14	hereby amended by adding the following sentence:-
15	(l) The board shall require that nurses complete training to address the needs of
16	individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
17	SECTION 5. Section 19 of said chapter 13 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
18	hereby amended by adding the following sentence:-
19	The board shall require that dental professionals complete training to address the needs of
20	individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
21	SECTION 6. Section 90 of said chapter 13 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
22	hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
23	The board shall require that allied mental health and human services professions
24	complete training to address the needs of individuals with intellectual and developmental
25	disabilities.
26	SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the office of
27	health equity within the executive office of health and human services, shall evaluate the access
28	to medical care, unmet mental health needs, discrimination, relationships with community
29	support specialists, and increasing the amount of qualified trained health care providers for
30	individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The executive office of health and
31	human services shall, based on such evaluation, promulgate rules and regulations to reduce the
