By Ms. Peake of Provincetown, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4054) of Sarah K. Peake (by vote of the town) relative to amending the charter of the town of Provincetown as relates to the finance committee of said town. Municipalities and Regional Government. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act Relative to the Finance Committee of the Town of Provincetown.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1: Chapter 6, §7-1 of the Charter of the Town of Provincetown is hereby
2 amended by deleting the current text which reads: “There shall be a finance committee as
3 provided by G.L. c. 39 s 16, consisting of nine regular members and two alternate members
4 appointed by the moderator for three year overlapping terms so arranged that the terms of at least
5 three regular members shall expire each year,” and replacing it with the following:

6 “There shall be a finance committee as provided by G.L. c. 39 s 16, consisting of seven
7 regular members and two alternate members appointed by the moderator for three year
8 overlapping terms so arranged that the terms of at least three members shall expire each year,
9 provided that no more than one alternate member’s term expires in any given year.”

10 Transitional provisions:

11 1. The effective date of this change to the charter will be the last day of April
12 following final passage and approval of the act.

13 2. As the terms of members expire over the next three years following the effective
14 date of the act, the Moderator will adjust the terms so that the terms of three members including
15 the alternate members will expire each year, with no more than one alternate member's term
16 expiring in any given year.
