2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following subsection:-

3 (e) Whoever violates this section and causes serious bodily injury upon a police officer

4 shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 5 years or in a jail or

5 house of correction for not more than 2 1/2

years, or by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
For the purposes of this subsection, "serious bodily injury" shall mean bodily injury that results
in a permanent disfigurement, loss or impairment of a bodily function, limb or organ, or a

9 substantial risk of death.
