The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to historic homes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 266 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 95 the
2 following section: -

3 Section 95A.

4 In this section, "historic home" shall mean any dwelling house listed upon the register of
5 the Massachusetts historical society and identified by a plaque identifying the homestead as an
6 historic homestead.

7 Whoever willfully, intentionally and without right removes items from, including, but not
8 limited to, copper gutters, copper wiring, aluminum or brick; displaces, destroys, defaces, mars
9 or injures the walls, wainscoting or any other part of any historical home, or the appurtenances
10 there of, by cutting, breaking, writing or otherwise, shall be punished by a fine of not less than
11 \$100 and not more than \$1000 or by imprisonment for not more than 2 years. Any person
12 convicted under the provisions of this section shall in addition to the fine assessed, reimburse the
13 historic home owner for the total amount of damage incurred.
