An Act relative to historic homes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 266 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 95 the
- 2 following section: -
- 3 Section 95A.
- 4 In this section, "historic home" shall mean any dwelling house listed upon the register of
- 5 the Massachusetts historical society and identified by a plaque identifying the homestead as an
- 6 historic homestead.
- Whoever willfully, intentionally and without right removes items from, including, but not
- 8 limited to, copper gutters, copper wiring, aluminum or brick; displaces, destroys, defaces, mars
- 9 or injures the walls, wainscoting or any other part of any historical home, or the appurtenances
- there of, by cutting, breaking, writing or otherwise, shall be punished by a fine of not less than
- \$100 and not more than \$1000 or by imprisonment for not more than 2 years. Any person
- 12 convicted under the provisions of this section shall in addition to the fine assessed, reimburse the
- 13 historic home owner for the total amount of damage incurred.
