## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 265 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 13L the following section:-
- 3 Section 13M. Whoever commits an assault or assault and battery on a candidate running
- 4 for public office shall be punished by imprisonment in the house of correction for not less than
- 5 90 days not more than 2 ½ years or by a fine of not less than \$500 not more than \$5,000 or both.
