In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act Resolve creating a study into the promotion of a year of service by young people in the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. That a special commission consisting Two members of the Education
2	Committee of the Senate; Two Members of the Education Committee of the House; Two
3	members of the Senate Committee on Children and Families; Two members of the House
4	committee on Children and Families; the Commissioner of Education; the Chancellor of Higher
5	Education; the Commissioner of the Department of Youth Services; the Executive Director of
6	City Year Boston; and the Chief Executive Officer of the Boy and Girls Clubs of Massachusetts,
7	or such a designee as appointed by the above listed persons with the purpose of examining and
8	promoting of a year of public service by young people in the Commonwealth and the effects of
9	such service on the individual and the community.

Said commission shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and
study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
on or before the first Wednesday in November, two thousand and nine.
