An Act relative to municipal light plants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 47D of Chapter 164 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2004 2 Official Edition is hereby amended by striking out in lines 4-10 the words "when necessary for 3 protecting trade secrets, confidential, competitively sensitive or other proprietary information 4 provided in the course of proceedings conducted pursuant to this chapter when such municipal 5 lighting board determines that such disclosure will adversely affect its ability to conduct business 6 in relation to other entities making, selling, or distributing electric power and energy pursuant to 7 this chapter" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- when the municipal light plant 8 manager determines that disclosure of trade secrets, confidential, competitively sensitive or other proprietary information will adversely affect the plant's customers or its ability to conduct 9 10 business.
