Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1

2 Section 16A of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
3 Edition, is hereby amended by striking the words “in excess of five minutes” and inserting in
4 place thereof the following “in excess of two minutes”.
