In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act for veterans hunting and fishing licenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 11 of chapter 131 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the fifth paragraph the following paragraph:-

3 Notwithstanding the foregoing, no fee shall be charged for any license issued hereunder
4 to a veteran, as defined in clause forty-three of section 7 of chapter 4 and whose last discharge
5 or release from the armed forces of the United States was under honorable conditions and who is
6 a resident of the commonwealth. The commonwealth shall bear the cost of such waivers, not the
7 department.
