By Mr. Rogers of Norwood, petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 973) of John H. Rogers (by vote of the town) that the town of Norwood be authorized to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises. Consumer Protection and Professional licensure. [Local Approval Received].

An act authorizing the town of Norwood to grant an additional license for the sale of wines and malt beverages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the licensing
2 authority of the Town of Norwood may grant an additional license for the sale of wine and malt
3 beverages to be drunk on the premises, to Storyboard, LLC (Norwood Theatre) located at 109
4 Central Street in the Town of Norwood under section 12 of said chapter 138. The license shall be
5 subject to all of said chapter 138 except said section 17. The licensing authority shall not approve
6 the transfer of the license to any other location but it may grant the license to a new applicant at
7 the same location if the applicant files with the licensing authority a letter from the department of
8 revenue indicating that the license is in good standing with the department and that all applicable
9 taxes have been paid.

10 If the license granted under this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use, it shall
11 be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto,

12 to the licensing authority which may then grant the license to a new applicant at the same
13 location under the same conditions as specified in this act.

14 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
